

Ghost Towns

Tuscarora

This historic mining town once rivaled modern-day Elko. In 1878, Tuscarora peaked at 30,000 population. Today there are a handful of residents, including renowned potter. renowned potter Dennis Parks who operates the famous Tuscarora Pottery
School. The building
where Parks' shop
resides is characteristic of the jumbled
history of a Nevada
hoomtown. Built as 1859, the structure was moved to Cornucopia in 1860 and copia in 1860 and then back to Tusca-rora where it was Mrs. Sweifel's Boarding House, the Woods family residence, the post office, a telephone switchboard station and the
